Volunteer Peer Advocates with the Onside Project, Disability Action (aged 18+) support people with physical, sensory, learning, mental health or hidden disabilities to improve their health and well-being through increased social and digital involvement in the community. This role involves supporting participants during digital training sessions, providing ongoing support including practical support, such as attending activities in the community, providing one to one support to enable people with disabilities to continue with their hobbies and interests or engage in new ones and sharing your own skills, hobbies and interests to shape opportunities for people with disabilities.





Maybe you have an interest in supporting people living with dementia? Have good empathy and an ability to build rapport? DEEDS would love to hear from you!

DEEDS workers, partners and volunteers enable people living with dementia to live better for longer within their own communities. The project delivers weekly activity groups, social groups, carers' education and respite as well as a programme of events and activities

Compassionate Communities at Foyle Hospice are looking for volunteers for a project aimed at reducing isolation across various areas within the city and district. Could you give 1-2 hours a week to offer support and friendship to someone who feels isolated and alone because of illness? It might be as simple as going for a cup of tea, enjoying a shared interest or a trip to the community centre. Full training will be provided and support offered throughout your volunteering



Reading Rooms is a shared reading programme using a mix of short literature and talking points to encourage conversation, build confidence and resilience and promote health and mental well-being among children, young people and adults. When you become a volunteer, you will receive a bespoke, three day, OCN Level 2 accredited course in Facilitation Skills for Shared Reading.

Currently need volunteers for: Children In Need Project (children & young people 8 to 18 years), Donegal Children's Project Beyond the Walls (vulnerable young people and adults who have came into contact with the criminal justice system), Reading Friends (adults and older people), Literature Team (Sourcing stories and admin duties) and within the Psychology Team (Admin duties)



R.E.A.C.H Across is a cross community youth organisation for young people in the North-West Region of Northern Ireland providing a structured programme of activities/events and training to promote confidence and skills-base.

Victim Support NI

Witness & Community Service Volunteers provide emotional support and practical advice to victims of crime. Victim Support currently requires local volunteers in the North West area covering Derry City, Limavady and Strabane.

Witness Service volunteers are located within the courts providing support to victims and witnesses as their cases come to trial, accompanying them into court, advocating on their behalf and conducting pretrial court visits.

Community Service volunteers meet with victims shortly after a crime has been committed and provide emotional support and advice to help them through this period.



The local branch of the Catholic Guides of Ireland provides an enriching and varied programme of activities and skills for young girls (age 7-16) on a weekly basis - Wednesday evening from 6.30pm to 8pm in Steelstown. They would love to welcome on board any ladies (age 18+) who would be interested in volunteering as group leaders. Lots of support and training provided including first aid and safeguarding.



Oak Counselling is a free counselling service for local people in Derry/Londonderry and has a charity shop in the heart of the city to support its work. They are actively recruiting volunteers to help in the shop. If you have an hour or two to spare, they'd love to hear from you. All proceeds go to Oak Counselling Services which provides free, accessible counselling to all 16+

Volunteer Counsellor roles with Childline Foyle
